Suson Park is a favorite with a lot of kids. There are fishing lakes, a big playground and Suson Farm. You'll have to go onto the farm to get some of your Junior Ranger requirements, so check our website for summer and winter hours. Also, if you come during the winter, it is only open on weekends.

#3. When you exit the red barn, you'll see our corral with a big windmill in it. When the wind blows, you can watch the windmill spin and that brings water up from an underground well. Look at the base of the windmill and find the sign. This windmill was donated by two people – who are they? _____ & _____

#4. Next, go to the big barn. Just inside, on your right, you'll see the dairy cow milking stanchion. There is a vacuum gauge on the stanchion. What is the highest number on the gauge? _____



#5. Go further into the barn. Find the stalls with the Polled Herefords. These types of cattle were bred specifically to be hornless and started out with only 11 cattle. We have 2 Polled Herefords - Annie and Ruby. When was Ruby born? _____ What is the average weight of a Hereford bull? _____ How about the weight of a Hereford cow? _____
