



APPLICATION FOR WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Saint Louis County Waste District program can provide a waiver for quarterly waste collection services fees for certain qualifying properties. The assistance may be granted upon application by qualifying low-income properties that meet certain financial and policy guidelines.

Qualifications under these guidelines shall be evidenced by submission of one of the following (**please check submitted documents**):

- 1 month of current pay check stubs
- Letter from employer on letterhead with number of hours worked and dollar amount paid per hour.
- A letter from the Division of Employment (unemployment statement).
- Statement of Social Security Award letter, VA Benefits letter, Pension Letter.

Please check one of the following:

- Owner occupied property
- Rental Property

If the documentation provided meets the guidelines, the waiver may be granted.

Saint Louis County Department of Public Health's
Waste Collection District's Financial Assistance Program
Policies and Procedures

The Financial Assistance Program was developed to assist low income home owners residing within the eight waste collection districts of unincorporated St. Louis County, with payment of waste collection services.

Applicants may be directed to the Program either through the enforcement process or by the hauler.

The approval process will consist of verification of the following:

1. Property address and property owner.
2. Income level of all occupants of the residence.

Eligible applicants cannot have an annual income that exceeds 150% of the Federal poverty level.

Assistance will only be granted to owner occupied properties.

Assistance will be on a first come basis until funding is depleted.

Assistance will be provided for up to four consecutive quarters unless canceled by either party.

The applicant may reapply at the end of the fourth quarter and meet the criteria to continue with the program.

Applicants must inform the County of any changes to income or occupancy status.

Applicants selected must commit to recycling.

The district hauler will bill the Program directly and will be paid directly by the program.

The program will only pay for basic services to be provided to the residence including any eligible discounts.

The Program will not pay the previous balances or debt collection fees.

The Financial Assistance Program's goal is to make sure that County residents in need can still have access to basic waste collection services.
