Examination and Re-examination for Journeyman License

- A.** Upon determination by the Board that an applicant has satisfied the requirements of SLCRO 20,694; 101A.3.2, items 1 through 3 and is approved to take the journeyman test, said applicant must take the test within six (6) months of said approval date.
1. If requested in writing prior to the expiration of the above stated 6 month time period, the Board may grant an extension of up to ninety (90) days within which the test must be taken.
 2. If applicant does not take the examination within the prescribed time period including any extension, authorization to take the test is withdrawn and applicant shall submit a new application and a new application fee.
- B.** If an applicant fails to pass the examination for journeyman license, the applicant shall not be permitted to re-take the examination for a period of three (3) months from the date of examination failure.
1. A re-take of the examination must be completed within six (6) months of the original date the journeyman test was taken.
 2. Failure to retake the test within this six (6) months time period shall result in authorization to take the test being withdrawn and applicant shall submit a new application and a new application fee.
- Example:** Applicant takes journeyman exam on February 9 and fails. Re-exam cannot be taken until May 10. If re-exam is not taken by August 10, applicant must submit new application for license.
- C.** If the applicant fails to pass the examination a second time, the applicant shall not be permitted to re-take the examination for a period of one (1) year from the date of the second examination failure and the applicant shall submit a new application and a new application fee.
