

REGISTRATION

Am I registered to vote?

Visit sl.sos.mo.gov/elections/voterlookup to check your voter registration status.

How do I register to vote?

The deadline to register to vote in the November General Election was October 7, 2020. If you were not registered by that date, you will not be able to vote.

POLLING PLACES

Can I vote at any polling place in St. Louis County?

Yes.

How do I find out which polling places are closest to me?

Visit stlouiscovotes.com and choose the "Polling Place Lookup" button.

ABSENTEE & MAIL-IN BALLOTS

Can I still submit my absentee ballot?

You may submit your absentee ballot in-person at the Board of Elections through 7 p.m. on Election Day.

If I still need to get my absentee ballot notarized, where can I get it notarized at?

The BOE office has notaries available. On Election Day, the BOE is open from 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

If I forgot to mail my absentee or mail-in ballot, can I vote in person on Election Day?

Yes. Bring your ballot to a polling place on Election Day and surrender it. You may then vote in person at the polling place.

OTHER

What kind of ID do I need to vote?

- Current driver or non-driver license
- U.S. Passport
- Military ID
- Missouri Voter Identification Card
- Identification issued by the State of Missouri
- Identification issued by the U.S. Government
- State college/university ID
- Current utility bill
- Current bank statement
- Current government check
- Current paycheck
- Current government document

If you have no form of identification, but are a registered voter, you may cast a provisional ballot.

How can I find out what's on my ballot?

Visit stlouiscovotes.com and choose the "Your Sample Ballot" button to preview your sample ballot.

If I am physically disabled, what are my options for voting?

Curbside voting is available for anyone who is physically disabled.
